Jonathan Holloway, a U.S. historian, took office as the 21st president of Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, on July 1, 2020. He also serves as a University Professor and Distinguished Professor. President Holloway's scholarly work specializes in post-emancipation U.S. history with a focus on social and intellectual history.

Dr. Holloway, who began his academic career at the University of California, San Diego, received a bachelor's degree with honors in American studies from Stanford University and a Ph.D. in history from Yale University. Prior to accepting the presidency of Rutgers, Dr. Holloway was provost of Northwestern University from 2017 to 2020 and a member of the faculty of Yale University from 1999 to 2017.

The State University of New Jersey In 1945 and 1956, state legislative acts designated Rutgers as The State University of New Jersey.

Five Campus Communities Rutgers University–New Brunswick has facilities in the city of New Brunswick, the township of Piscataway, and several surrounding municipalities. The campus functions as a small, vibrant city, made up of five communities.

Prestigious Membership In 1989, Rutgers was invited to join the Association of American Universities (AAU), making Rutgers one of the top 71 research universities in North America.

Revolutionizing Health Care Rutgers Health, the health education, research, and clinical division of the university, was established in July 2013.


Busch Campus


Livingston Campus








Douglass Campus




George H. Cook Campus



The Big Chill is an annual 5K charity race in December where the entry fee is a toy donation benefiting children in the New Brunswick community. The Big Chill has been a staple within the Rutgers community for 20 years and is enjoyed by thousands of runners yearly.

Browse the Collections at the Zimmerli Art Museum

The Zimmerli Art Museum is one of the largest and most distinguished university-based museums in the country. With more than 60,000 works in its collection, the museum frequently updates the permanent galleries with works that spotlight an artist, period, or theme. Admission is free.



Enrich Yourself on an Alternative Break

The Rutgers University Alternative Break program provides groups of undergraduate students with a semester-long experience centered on community service. Participants learn about a particular community issue during five weeks of pre-trip meetings and a volunteer break excursion. On site, students provide necessary services and explore the culture and history of the area. Past locations include New Orleans, Nashville, California, Puerto Rico, and Washington, D.C.

Stargaze at the Observatory

Members of the Rutgers community and the general public are invited to observe the night sky through the 20-inch optical telescope of the Robert A. Schommer Astronomical Observatory, which is located in the dome on the roof of the Serin Physics Laboratories on the Busch campus. The observatory is open the second and fourth Thursday of every month (weather permitting).

Stroll Around Passion Puddle

Situated between the Cook and Douglass campuses the small pond is a favorite campus location for studying, enjoying nature, and young lovebirds.



Men's Basketball: Steve Pikiell

A father of four who has led the resurgence of Rutgers Basketball both on and off the court, Steve Pikiell has spent seven seasons as head coach of the Scarlet Knights. Under Pikiell's leadership, the team returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2021, making its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1991. The Scarlet Knights returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2022, marking the first time Rutgers has made the big dance in consecutive seasons since 1976. In 2022, Pikiell surpassed Tom Young with the most ranked wins in school history.

With 31 years of coaching experience, the Bristol, CT native is under contract to remain courtside at Jersey Mike's Arena through 2030-31 under a recently signed contract extension. As the 19th head coach in the history of Rutgers men's basketball, Pikiell has been instrumental in turnarounds throughout his playing and coaching career that have resulted in conference championships and NCAA berths. Pikiell received his 100th career victory at Rutgers and 300th career victory during the 2022-23 season.

Women's Basketball: Coquese Washington

Coquese Washington was named the third full-time head coach in the history of Rutgers women's basketball on May 23, 2022. A three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year during her 12-year tenure at Penn State, Washington most recently served as associate head coach at Notre Dame for two seasons. She arrived "On the Banks" with 22 years of experience coaching championship-caliber basketball and program building.

During her first year at the helm of the Scarlet Knights, Washington set a solid foundation for the team. She guided the program to reach its 1,000th win with a victory over Minnesota (Jan. 12) on the road, becoming the 22nd Division I team and the third squad in the Big Ten to reach the milestone. In the same game against the Gophers, Washington also picked up her 100th Big Ten win.

Washington helped to lead freshman guard Kaylene Smikle to greatness, as she was named to the All-Big Ten Second Team (Media & Coaches) in addition to the All-Freshman Team (Media & Coaches). The guard also collected three Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors, the most in program history. Under Washington's guidance, Smikle became the all-time leading freshman scorer in program history, ending the season with 573 points.






