





## Traditions



Block M on the Diag A gift from the Class of 1953, the bronze Block M has a legend attached to it: if you step on it, you'll fail your first blue book exam.

Winged Helmet Until Fritz Crisler arrived in 1938, football players had plain black helmets. Crisler recommended a more unique helmet that could help passers spot their receivers downfield. Today, U-M's maize and blue winged helmet is one of the most recognizable symbols in college football.

Maize & Blue In 1867, students chose maize and azure blue as the school colors. Today, the university uses PMS 282 and PMS 7406, a maize-and-blue color palette that represents shades used by school officials and the Athletic Department through the years.

Michigan Marching Band Nothing says spirit like the Michigan Marching Band! Historically ranked as one of the best in the nation, it was formed in 1896 and is an important part of every football Saturday.

The Wolverine Since the earliest days of documented U-M history (as early as 1861), students, alumni, and fans have been referring to themselves as "Wolverines," although no one knows exactly why.

Engineering Arch Legend has it that if two Wolverines kiss under the arch at midnight, they are destined to marry.

## Libraries



Hatcher Library houses the Reference Reading Room, Asia Library, Clark Library, Papyrology Collection, and Special Collections Research Center. Located on Central Campus.

#### **William L. Clements Library**

houses print and manuscript sources relating to early American history. Located on Central Campus.

Shapiro Library includes media production spaces, the Computer and Video Game Archive, film and video resources, a first-floor cafe, extensive study spaces, and more. Located on Central Campus.

Fine Arts Library supports the study of visual art, art history, museum studies, and related disciplines. Located inside Tappan Hall on Central Campus.

Law Library contains one of the world's best collections of legal research materials, including more than one million volumes and 500,000 titles. Located on Central Campus.





# Research to Serve the World



As one of the nation's leading public research universities, the University of Michigan and its students, faculty, and staff play a critical role in addressing emerging challenges and opportunities in areas of broad societal impact.

With 19 schools and colleges and more than 200 centers and institutes, U-M research, scholarship, and creative practice spans nearly every major facet of science, engineering, medicine, social sciences, business, the arts and humanities, public policy, and education.

The university has conducted more than \$1 billion in research for 14 consecutive years, and in fiscal year 2023, research expenditures totaled \$1.86 billion.

Numbers like this are important in order to comprehend the vast amount of research, scholarship, and creative practice catalyzed at U-M, but even more important is the university's collective focus on how that funding benefits society as a whole.

Research at U-M leads to advancements in fields ranging from Great Lakes sustainability and driverless vehicle technologies to chronic disease and firearm injury prevention.

And it's not just excellence across a broad spectrum that sparks innovative research at U-M. It's the unique opportunity for collaboration across the campuses and beyond that has led to the university's exceptional record of achievement.

Working together across disciplines is a hallmark of U-M, as researchers collaborate to advance knowledge, solve challenging problems, create new products, and enhance quality of life.

U-M's research enterprise not only provides remarkably fertile ground for generating new ideas and insights—it also enhances both undergraduate and graduate education.

In the classroom and through direct involvement in research, students develop a spirit of inquiry and creativity that prepares them to make a difference no matter what careers they pursue.



# Health and Well-being





In September 2021, U-M joined seven other U.S. universities in adopting the Okanagan Charter, pledging a commitment to take a holistic and sustainable approach to becoming a health-promoting university.

Today, this work is led by the Well-being Collective, a collaborative effort focused on making U-M a better place to live, work, and learn for our students, faculty, and staff by implementing a systemwide approach to supporting well-being across our campus.




#### **Health and Wellness Resources**

# Campus Sustainability



Through education, research, and operations, U-M is taking action on climate and innovating toward sustainability.

- Our educational programs encourage environmental literacy and inspire students to become lifelong sustainability advocates, personally and professionally.
- Our research programs draw on our commitment to the public good and our knowledge across disciplines to address major sustainability challenges, locally and globally.
- Our operations push toward carbon neutrality, setting an example for others who wish to do the same, and using our campus as a living-learning laboratory.

Combined efforts in these three areas represent our institutional commitment to sustainability, known as Planet Blue. As a visitor on campus, you'll experience a range of benefits that stem from Planet Blue, including:

- Pollinator gardens, native prairies, and tree plantings across campus that create a healthy, beautiful outdoor environment.
- Student-grown food from the Farm Stand, a collaboration between our Campus Farm and Sustainable Food Program that offers fresh produce and education about local food systems to the campus community.
- Campus waste solutions like composting bins, recycling bins, and 400+ water bottle filling stations across campus.
- Hybrid-electric buses that encourage commuting and result in less air pollution and fuel consumption.



#### **Climate Action**

Carbon neutrality is achieved when all quantifiable greenhouse gas emissions are eliminated or offset by investments in carbon credits or sequestration projects. In May 2021, U-M committed to achieving carbon neutrality in alignment with international science-based guidelines. This ongoing effort spans the Dearborn, Flint, and Ann Arbor campuses, Michigan Medicine, and Athletics.

The **Ginsberg Center** is a community and civic engagement center with a mission to cultivate and steward equitable partnerships between communities and U-M. Its goal is to advance social change for the public good through social justice education, workshops, and hands-on opportunities with community organizations.

The Center also partners with faculty and staff to enhance student learning through consultation. This is achieved by connecting socially just community experiences to coursework, programs, and research. Hundreds of local opportunities are listed on the Center's volunteer portal at **connect2community.umich.edu**. Students can explore opportunities for employment, work-study, and internships. For instance, at Storytelling for Social Change, students create audio/visual products—things like social media templates, videos, and images—that help community organizations tell their stories.

The Ginsberg Center is also U-M's hub for democratic engagement, with a focus on nonpartisan voter engagement, civics and media literacy, and dialogue across difference. Specific work includes the Big Ten Voting Challenge and Pathways to Civic Engagement.

Organization Peer Advisors are also available to help students find community and get involved on campus.
















# University Unions
