# Life on Campus



The Terp experience is much more than classes and homework. It encompasses residence hall life, clubs and sports, fraternities and sororities, campus events and even off-campus destinations. All students here have opportunities to create a unique identity and to grow as individuals even as they're part of a close-knit and diverse community.

### **Residence Halls**

Nine out of every 10 freshmen at Maryland choose to live on campus. That's 9,600 Terps living in 39 residence halls that offer a variety of room types: traditional rooms, suites, semi-suites or apartment-style accommodations. The Department of Resident Life can connect new students with potential on-campus roommates and help them pick the right housing option for them.

### **Living-Learning Programs**

Maryland's highly respected living-learning programs bring together students with a common interest—the environment, law, entrepreneurship, the digital humanities and many others—to share residence halls, classrooms and faculty. These students bond with each other and their instructors as they participate in special out-of-the-classroom opportunities designed to enhance their education. More than half of all first-year students participate in one of the 26 living-learning communities, including the Honors College, CIVICUS and College Park Scholars.

### **Getting Involved**

Our students take part in more than 700 organizations, focused on sports, the arts, academics, service to the community, religion and much more. All it takes is five people on campus with a common interest to start a new club. Fraternity and sorority life is active at Maryland, with 16% of undergraduates participating in UMD's recognized Greek-letter organizations. These include 27 social fraternities, six of which are culturally based organizations, and 28 social sororities, with 12 culturally based houses.

### **Recreation and Wellness**

A fun and essential aspect of life at UMD is being part of the "Active Terp" community—a vibrant, diverse group that plays, explores, trains, competes and supports one another. Physical activity gives students the energy to make the most of what UMD has to offer, creating a foundation for academic excellence.

University Recreation & Wellness, known as RecWell, offers a wide array of options for having fun and being active at its sites:

#### **EPPLEY RECREATION CENTER**

The biggest fitness hub on campus, Eppley includes an Olympic-size indoor pool; outdoor pool; 55-foot climbing wall; challenge course; basketball, racquetball and squash courts; multipurpose rooms; fitness and weight rooms; functional training studio; and sauna and steam room.

### RECKORD ARMORY

This indoor facility houses basketball, volleyball and badminton courts, and is home to the intramural sports program, which has around 7,700 participants each year.

#### RITCHIE COLISEUM

This former arena for Terp athletic teams features a basketball court. fitness room, weight room, functional training space and multipurpose room, and houses athletic trainers.

### UNIVERSITY GOLF COURSE

The home of the Maryland men's and women's golf teams is an 18-hole, Audobon-certified public course.

### Students and sponsored guests

are welcome at any of over 100 drop-in fitness classes offered weekly, such as yoga, cycling, Zumba and hip-hop shake. There are also more than 45 sports clubs, including boxing, figure skating, paintball and sailing.

For Terps who like to be active outdoors, the RecWell Adventure Program offers backpacking, caving, kayaking and other trips as well as outdoor gear rental and a campus bike shop for bike rentals and free maintenance.

### **Getting Around**

Wherever students live, the Department of Transportation Services offers a variety of options for reaching any destination.

### **BUSES**

Shuttle-UM provides free bus service on and around campus and beyond. Metrobuses frequently stop at UMD, too. Transit is a GPS tracking system that provides accurate, real-time arrival information for all Shuttle-UM routes. Users can find and track a bus by phone, text messages, monitors located at the Stamp and the Department of Transportation Services office, bus shelter LED screens and online.

### SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORTATION

Smart Commute connects students, faculty and staff with green commuting options, including transit, carpool, bike routes and walking paths. Those who log their trips through the program's digital platform earn rewards for making environmentally friendly transportation choices.

### **E-BIKES AND SCOOTERS**

E-bikes and e-scooters are available for rent through Veo at UMD and around College Park. Privately owned e-scooters and e-bicycles must be registered with the Department of Transportation Services.

### **VEHICLES**

Students can register online for on-campus parking spaces, which are in limited supply. Freshman residents must apply to park on campus. Carpooling is encouraged through the Smart Commute program, which offers discounted parking when at least two active permits/registrations are presented in exchange for a carpool permit. Zipcar allows students who need a car only occasionally to rent one on campus.

### **Academics 101**

Maryland has 12 colleges and schools, as well as Letters and Sciences, which provides advising for undergraduates who are deciding on their majors. Most of our schools and colleges have been recognized by U.S. News & World Report or other ranking authorities as among the best in the nation and in some cases as the No. 1 programs of their kind.

In Spring 2023, the university awarded 8,092 bachelor's degrees, 3,060 master's degrees and 664 doctoral degrees. The most popular undergraduate majors are computer science, information science, finance, public health science, mechanical engineering, communication, and criminology and criminal justice.


### **Undergraduate Study**

Our 12 schools and colleges offer over 100 undergraduate degree programs and 80-plus minors. Terps are consistently ranked among the highest achievers in the state, nation and the world, with approximately 58,000 students applying for about 4,750 first-year seats for Fall 2023. We encourage students to pursue their passions and make connections beyond the classroom. More than half of all first-year students find their niche in special living-learning programs that allow students with common academic interests to share residence halls, courses and hands-on experiences. Other exciting opportunities include study abroad, Washington, D.C.-area internships and facultyassisted research.

### 1 The Hotel at the University of Maryland

The four-star, 300-room hotel and conference center just across from the main entrance to campus includes a spa, restaurants and ample meeting space.

### 2 The Hall CP

This is a unique and lively space where members of the community gather, collaborate and dine indoors or in the "backyard" space. It hosts live performances, weekend brunches and other events.

### 3 College Park Academy

The highly competitive public charter school launched in collaboration with UMD combines the flexibility of online studies with the support of traditional classrooms for grades 6-12.

### 4 Discovery District

The bustling research park includes lonQ and the Quantum Startup Foundry (reinforcing UMD's reputation as the "Capital of Quantum"), and companies like The Shed, a rehearsal studio space; Medcura, a biomedical device developer; and Cybrary, a cybersecurity startup.

The Greater College Park initiative brings together the university, the city, and state and federal partners to reimagine the Baltimore Avenue corridor, along the tracks of the coming light-rail Purple Line and around the College Park Metro Station.







### 5 The Aster

A mixed-use community of nearly 400 apartments geared to graduate students, faculty and staff opened in Fall 2022 with amenities such as an outdoor pool, pet spa, coworking space and the popular grocer Trader Joe's.

### 6 Vigilante Coffee Co.

The specialty coffee roaster serves single-origin coffees along with coffee education at a hip café.

### 7 Diamondback Garage

Global companies and UMD startups come together in 20,000 square feet of high-tech collaboration and office space that also hosts the Capital One Tech Center, Adobe and Immuta.



### **Iconic Landmarks**

# A visit to Maryland isn't complete without stopping at our best-known facilities and attractions.

Considered the largest academic mall in the nation, McKeldin Mall is a popular gathering spot and is used for major events like Maryland Day and Art Attack. Check out the Omicron Delta Kappa cascading fountain and the sundial also located on the Mall. The Adele H. Stamp Student Union-Center for Campus Life, better known as the Stamp, is the hub of student activity on campus, home to the University Book Center, Hoff Theater, Stamp Gallery, a food court and TerpZone (bowling, billiards, video games).

### 1 Rossborough Inn

Built between 1804 and 1812, the building and its 428 acres were sold by Charles Benedict Calvert to help found what was then called the Maryland Agricultural College.



### 2 Memorial Chapel

Dedicated in 1952, the non-denominational chapel honors members of the university community who lost their lives serving in the U.S. armed forces. Its steeple is the highest point on campus.









### 3 The "M"

The giant floral "M" brightly welcomes visitors and is a popular backdrop for Terp graduation photos. More than 850 flowers are planted there twice a year.

### 4 McKeldin Mall

The Omicron Delta Kappa Fountain, etched with quotes from President Franklin Delano Roosevelt and the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., is a highlight of the nine-acre grassy expanse. The sundial is a gift from the Class of 1965.

### 5 Testudo at McKeldin Mall

Rubbing the nose on this bronze statue for good luck is one of the university's best-known traditions. It's one of seven bronze Testudo statues across campus.



### 6 Frederick Douglass Square at Hornbake Plaza

A memorial featuring a striking 8-foottall bronze statue honors the Maryland native who was an abolitionist, orator and advocate for women's rights.



The protagonist of the long-running "Diary of a Wimpy Kid" series of books by Jeff Kinney '93 is immortalized in bronze in the Stamp's ground floor north atrium, near TerpZone.









### 8 Jim Henson Sculpture

This life-size homage to the 1960 graduate and Muppets creator shows him sitting with Kermit on a bench outside the Stamp, with just enough room for a visitor to join them.

### 9 Samuel Riggs IV **Alumni Center**

The center is a monument to the achievements of Maryland graduates and a gathering place for friends of the university. Outside the building is the Frann G. & Eric S. Francis Lifetime Member Wall, where over 14,000 loyal Terps have cemented their legacy in the University of Maryland Alumni Association.

# **Arts at Maryland**

The University of Maryland is home to a vibrant arts community, where students, scholars, faculty, alumni and visiting artists transform ideas into exciting and thought-provoking experiences and invite audiences to take part in the creative process.

In 2021, President Darryll J. Pines announced the campuswide Arts for All initiative, which leverages the combined power of the arts, technology and social justice to address the grand challenges of our time.

The center presents several public exhibitions and events each year.

Beyond the classroom, Maryland's bustling campus provides a world of opportunity for students to have fun, get involved and do good.

### 1 Eppley Recreation Center

Named in honor of former varsity athlete, track coach and assistant professor of agronomy Geary "Swede" Eppley, the ERC houses indoor and outdoor swimming pools, fitness machines, squash courts, a running track, and an outdoor climbing wall and ropes course.

### 2 Heritage Community

About 900 first- and second-year students live in this new residential complex on North Campus featuring Pyon-Chen and Johnson-Whittle halls, both named for trailblazing Terps of color. Yahentamitsi Dining Hall, whose name means "a place to go to eat" in the Algonquian language spoken by the Indigenous Piscataway people who lived on the land that's now UMD, is also part of the Heritage Community.


### 3 Adele H. Stamp Student Union

The heart of student activity on campus, it houses the University Book Center, Hoff Theater, food court, Art Gallery and the TerpZone entertainment hub.

### 4 Nyumburu Cultural Center

Named for the Swahili word for "freedom house," this is the center for social, cultural and intellectual African-American interaction.









### 5 Edward St. John Learning and Teaching Center

The bustling academic building features 13 general purpose classrooms and nine state-of-the art chemistry teaching labs, plus a wide variety of informal collaborative learning and study spaces.

### 6 McKeldin Library

The largest library on campus, McKeldin supports many of the research and teaching needs of the Maryland community. Highlights include the collaborative Terrapin Learning Commons, a high-tech makerspace, a reflection room-and two napping pods.

### 7 South Campus Commons

This residential complex provides convenient apartment-style living on campus to 1,825 undergraduate students. Nearby, the South Campus Dining Hall offers an array of culinary options, and right above it are the student-run newspaper, The Diamondback, and radio station, WMUC 90.5 FM.

### 8 Fraternity Row

This site of the first campus football stadium now includes houses for nine fraternities, four sororities, and a center for culturally based fraternities and sororities. Built in the 1950s for fraternities alone, the neighborhood has a partner around the corner: the Graham Cracker of sorority houses. It earned that name when the square lots were cleared for construction and the clay ground had to be aerated with small round holes.

# **Research & Discovery**

With stunning new research buildings opening around campus and a strategic location that fosters partnerships with government and industry, the University of Maryland is uniquely positioned for research that addresses the grand challenges of our time.

Maryland researchers take on vital issues like clean energy, the unparalleled promise of quantum technology and new approaches to brain health in dozens of research centers and institutes. These include the Brain and Behavior Institute, the Maryland Energy Innovation Institute, the Institute for Advanced Computer Studies and the Joint Quantum Institute, a globally renowned partnership with the National Institute of Standards and Technology. Other federal partnerships with NOAA, NASA and more propel UMD's expertise worldwide.

#### 2 Collaboratory

Located in the Parren J. Mitchell Art-Sociology Building, the Michelle Smith Collaboratory for Visual Culture features an IMAX-like screen and other technology to study art and architecture in novel ways.



#### 1 E.A. Fernandez **IDEA Factory**

Students and researchers come together in this 2022 building to push the limits of innovation and entrepreneurship. It boasts an underground quantum lab, spaces to test advanced robots and the XFoundry, which will host a new XPRIZE-inspired competition awarding up to \$2 million for student solutions to grand challenges.









#### 3 MakerBot **Innovation Center**

This facility in the Technology Advancement Program Building has dozens of MakerBot 3-D printers, more than tripling the number in the A. James Clark School of Engineering and putting the future of manufacturing in reach of all Maryland students.

#### 4 The Brendan Iribe **Center for Computer Science and Engineering**

Opened in 2019, this dramatic presence on Baltimore Avenue unites our top-ranked computer science department with the acclaimed Institute for Advanced Computer Studies, creating a hub for technology in UMD's Discovery District.

#### 5 Campus Farm

This small working farm, which provides hands-on training to students in the animal sciences, includes sheep, cattle, horses and poultry, and harkens back to the university's founding in 1856 as the Maryland Agricultural College.

# **Terrapin Athletics**

The University of Maryland has long had one of the most visible, recognizable and successful programs in the country.

Today, Maryland offers 19 intercollegiate sports: 11 for women and eight for men.

More than 500 student athletes compete each year at the top level of college athletics, most of them as members of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I teams.

Eight Terrapin programs have combined to win 47 national championships, from the football team in 1953 to the 2022 men's lacrosse team finishing with a perfect 18-0 record to earn its 13th national title. Maryland is one of just two schools in history to have won the NCAA championship in both men's and women's basketball. Since joining the Big Ten Conference in 2014, UMD has racked up 45 regular season and tournament championships, which ranks third among all of the conference's schools in that span.

#### 1 Jones-Hill House

The new home of Maryland football, this premier facility in Cole Field House honors two Terps who broke the color barrier in Maryland Athletics more than 50 years ago. It features an indoor practice facility, Athletics offices, locker rooms, dining and workout areas, and outdoor practice fields.







#### 3 LudwigField

This complex for the Terrapin men's and women's soccer teams (and their hyped-up fans, known as "The Crew") is fully lit with an all-weather track and sodded Bermuda grass playing field. It's hosted many NCAA tournaments and nationally televised games, including U.S. and professional soccer matches.

#### 4 Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium

Named for alumnus Bob "Turtle" Smith, it has been home to Maryland baseball since 1965. It was upgraded in 2015 with a new high-tech playing surface, drainage system, bullpen and outfield wall.

# **African American History**

African Americans have made important contributions to the university from its pre-Civil War founding through the present day.

An online campus tour explores their role—including their struggles and achievements—and celebrates trailblazing African Americans in the state and nation. The African American History Tour, sponsored by the Office of Diversity and Inclusion, tells this story through 17 campus landmarks.

#### 1 The Rossborough Inn

A bench outside the oldest building on campus honors the role that African Americans played in constructing and serving the university since it was founded in 1856. Charles Benedict Calvert, a slaveholding planter and politician, sold a portion of his 428-acre Rossburg Farm property, including the inn, to found the Maryland Agricultural College.

#### 2 Thurgood Marshall Hall

The new School of Public Policy building bears the name of the late civil rights lawyer and former U.S. Supreme Court justice. It honors his role in breaking down barriers for African American students, including the desegregation of the University of Maryland.




#### 3 Lt. Richard L. Collins III Plaza

A new contemplative space honors the life and legacy of a former Bowie State University student killed on the College Park campus in 2017. It features a replica of the Unity Mural, created by students at both schools after the tragedy seeking hope and peace.











#### 4 Parren J. Mitchell **Art-Sociology Building**

Parren J. Mitchell M.A. '52 sued UMD to become the first African American graduate student to take all of his classes on campus and receive a degree. Mitchell went on to become a civil rights leader and Maryland's first Black congressman.

#### 5 Johnson-Whittle Hall


UMD's newest dorm is named for two trailblazing Black Terps who played important roles in diversifying the University of Maryland campus. It honors Hiram Whittle, the first African American man admitted to the university, in 1951; and Elaine Johnson Coates, the first African American woman to graduate with an undergraduate degree, in 1959.

#### 6 Nyumburu Cultural Center

Named for the Swahili word for "freedom house," the center recently celebrated its 50th anniversary as the hub for social, cultural and intellectual African American interaction on campus.

#### 7 Frederick Douglass Square, Hornbake Plaza

One of the most important figures in Maryland history, Frederick Douglass (1818-95) is honored with an 8-foottall bronze statue unveiled in 2015. Born into slavery in Talbot County, Md., Douglass taught himself to read and write on the streets of Baltimore before escaping at age 20. Douglass went on to become a powerful voice for abolition and women's rights.



# **Green Maryland**

UMD is a living laboratory for sustainability where students, faculty and staff contribute to greening the campus and solving the grand challenges of our time. Over 26% of academic courses include sustainability as a theme. Research informs conversation from local to international levels.

The university is committed to achieving net-zero carbon by 2025. The campus is an arboretum and botanical garden of international distinction with 15,000 trees and plants. Campus operation includes over 9,000 solar panels, retrofitted buildings with efficient equipment, over two million square feet of certified-green building space, sustainable food procurement, and recycling and compost collection in buildings.

UMD is the world's first university to join the Coolfood Pledge, a growing movement of workplaces, hotels, hospitals and restaurants reducing the climate impact of dining. Food served in dining halls includes vegetables grown at Terp Farm, a nearby UMD agriculture research facility.

In 2022, Maryland earned a Gold rating for sustainability from the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education for its dedication to environmental and social leadership.

#### 1 Biowall at McKeldin Library

About 1,000 plants freshen the view and air on the main library's ground floor. The vertical planting has eight species of greenery and uses just 20 to 30 gallons of water daily.

#### 2 The Brendan Iribe **Center for Computer Science** and Engineering

The first carbon-neutral building on campus, the Iribe Center is certified under the International Green Construction Code. It touts two green roofs, energy-efficient lighting and sustainable landscaping, including a bioswale and native species.


#### 3 Farmers Market in Tawes Plaza

Offered for more than a decade, the farmers market in Tawes Plaza opens at 11 a.m. Wednesdays in spring and fall and features local vendors and cooking demonstrations.

#### 4 Community Learning Garden

Between the Eppley Recreation Center and the School of Public Health building, the garden provides a living classroom that educates visitors on the importance of environmental stewardship, agricultural sustainability, physical activity and balanced diets. All crops grown are provided to the Campus Pantry.













