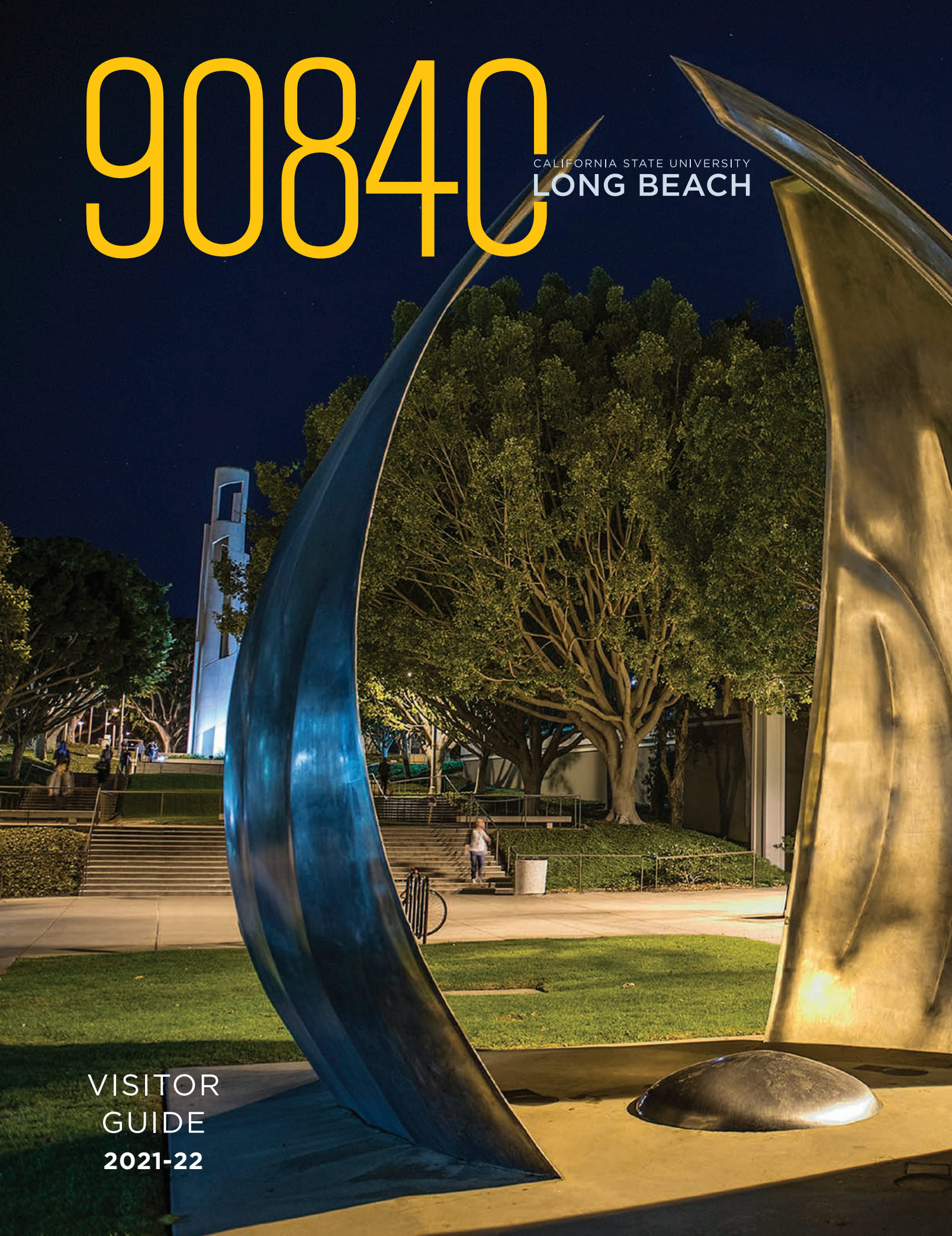

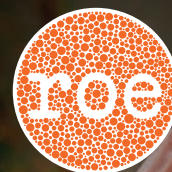

HOUSING

Students will find a new residential hall and renovated rooms when they return to campus as part of the Housing Expansion project. Parkside North Housing hall will provide an additional 476 beds and feature pod study rooms, kitchens, multiple levels of community space and a courtyard. The Los Alamitos and Los Cerritos buildings were updated with an elevator, new electrical system, roofs, alarm systems and finishes inside the rooms. Two new buildings will house the Administration and Commons, where students will find five one- and two-bedroom apartments and outdoor spaces. The coeducational Beachside, Hillside and Parkside College dorms will provide comfortable and unique living experiences, with single, double and triple occupancy, where students can be part of campus culture.

CAROLYN CAMPAGNA KLEEFELD CONTEMPORARY ART MUSEUM

The **CAROLYN CAMPAGNA KLEEFELD CONTEMPORARY ART MUSEUM (KLEEFELD CONTEMPORARY)** houses exhibitions and programs that provide space for critical interpretation of contemporary and modern art, as well as culture.

The museum is completing an extensive \$10 million expansion and renovation that will feature three exhibition galleries, a reading and archives room and other updated spaces. When the campus museum re-opens in 2022, it will enable the community to enjoy better access to quality art. During the renovations, the Kleefeld Contemporary will have projects on and off campus, and a possible installation of new sculptures on campus.

According to Pfeiffer Architects, the museum will be expanded to roughly 11,000 square feet, with a larger gallery space and a new entry zone that “will create a stronger inter-

face between the museum, students and broader community, while improving operational flexibility, museum security and access to Kleefeld Contemporary’s print and archives.”

The renovated space also will have an array of indoor/outdoor opportunities for activities, performances and events.

When completed, the museum will continue to invite students and the public to engage, collaborate and share through various forms of art. Kleefeld Contemporary is only one of two museums in the Cal State system accredited by the American Alliance of Museums, an honor reserved for the top 10% of museums in the nation.

Participatory programming in community spaces will continue to connect students to contemporary art via interactive arts integration activities, resulting in collaborative and educational opportunities.

The museum honors the generosity of Carolyn Campagna Kleefeld, an artist, poet and passionate supporter of authentic self-expression and journeys into the great artistic unknown. Her gift empowers the museum to grow and allows for unprecedented collection access, and STEAM educational partnerships. All community members are encouraged to visit.

Upon its reopening, admission to the Kleefeld Contemporary will be free.



CAMPUS MAP

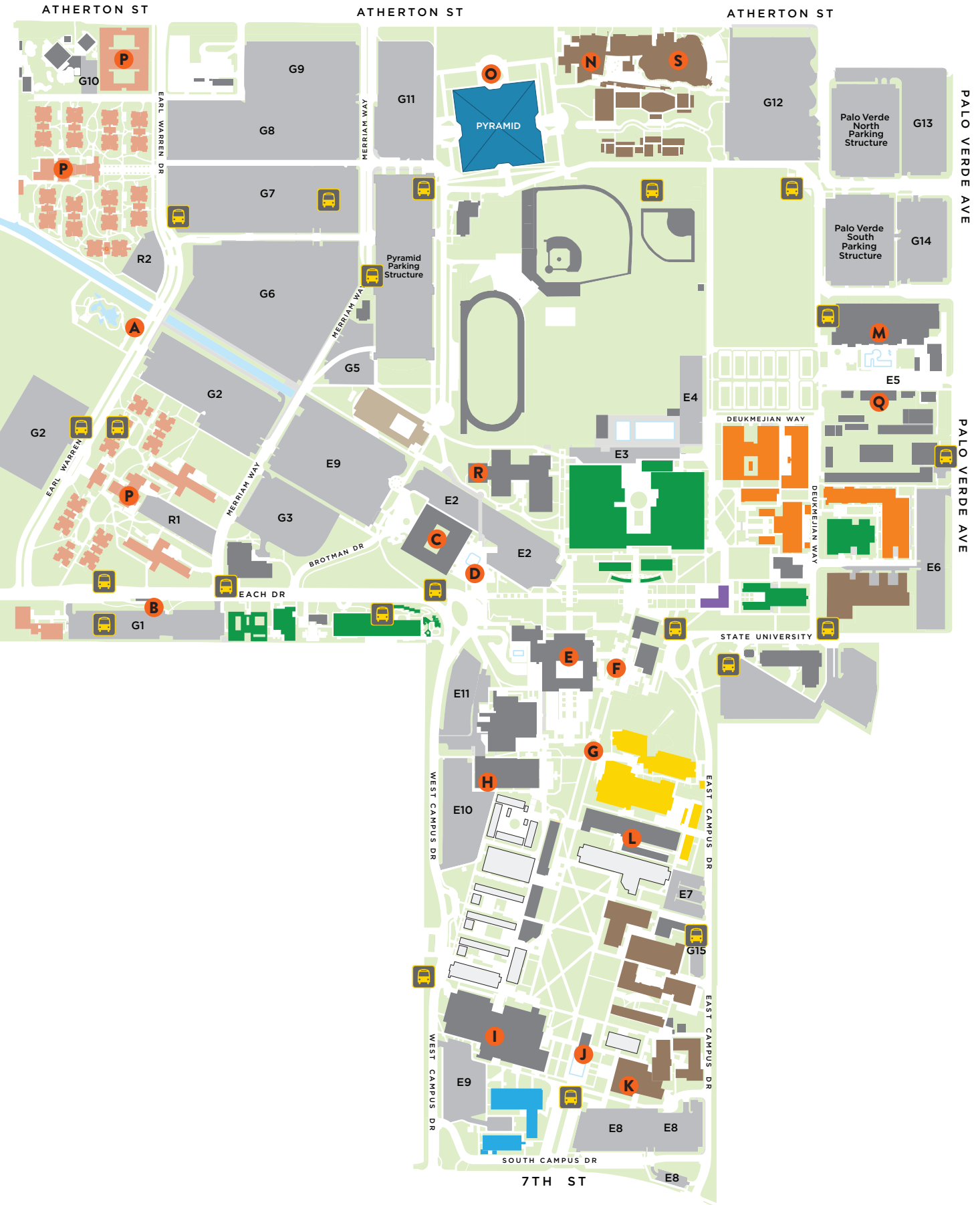

ATHLETICS

The pandemic altered the athletics landscape in the 2020-21 academic year with canceled games, seasons missed and opportunities lost for hundreds of athletes. When competitions did come back in the fall with 10 sports, the athletes were ready to continue the excellence of Beach athletics. The men's golf team reached the NCAA Regionals for the first time in nine years after claiming its third Big West championship.

Softball qualified for the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 2018 after claiming the Big West title with an overall 30-11 record. The Beach swept Cal State Fullerton in a three-game series on the final weekend of the regular season to advance.

Women's basketball also enjoyed a successful season, finishing third in the Big West with a 12-9 overall, 11-7 conference record.

CAMPUS SHUTTLE ROUTES

The Beachside Shuttle takes students to Beachside College, the off-site housing located on PCH near Clark Ave. Priority seating is offered to Beachside residents with Beachside ID sticker.

On-campus shuttles are free to all currently enrolled students, as well as faculty and staff members with valid university ID.

BY SCOOTER

Getting around Long Beach got easier and a bit more fun when the city approved electric scooters as a viable means of transportation. Several companies have set up in Long Beach, giving riders more opportunities to navigate the city.

Riders need to be 18 years of age and in possession of a driver's license per California Vehicle Code. Riders are encouraged to wear a helmet and may request one for free from an operator. E-scooters cannot be ridden on the sidewalk, riders must use a bike lane whenever possible and need to park the scooters around the perimeter of the campus out of the street and out of the public right of way. If riders have questions or issues, they should email E-ScooterShare@longbeach.gov.

BY BUS

Several Long Beach Transit stops located on and around campus make it easy to get around Long Beach, Signal Hill and parts of Artesia, Bellflower, Carson, Cerritos, Compton, Hawaiian Garden, Norwalk, Paramount and Seal Beach. To find the best route for your travel needs, use any map application and select the transit icon.

Regular fare is \$1.25 for a single ride. Bus fareboxes accept coins and dollar bills, but do not make change. Riders can also pay their fare on the TAP mobile app.

The LBT Passport line is a free bus that connects passengers to downtown Long Beach's finest attractions and destinations, including the iconic Queen Mary, Aquarium of the Pacific, Convention Center and Long Beach Transit's water taxis.

ON BICYCLE

The City of Long Beach and the CSULB campus are recognized by the League of American Bicyclists for their bike friendliness. The city has over 156 miles of bikeways, and the campus has a wheel path, over 60 bike racks, outdoor fix-it stations, and bicycle registration available for riders.



SUSTAINABILITY



CSULB COMMITS TO PROMOTING SUSTAINABILITY THROUGH OUR CAMPUS OPERATIONS, ACADEMIC PROGRAMS, AND ENGAGEMENT EFFORTS. CONSERVING WATER IS ONE OF THE UNIVERSITY'S PRIMARY GOALS. NOT ONLY HAS THE CAMPUS INSTALLED IRRIGATION STRATEGIES, LANDSCAPERS HAVE CREATED AREAS CALLED BIOSWALES - NATURALLY OCCURRING CHANNELS THAT CAPTURE AND DIRECT STORM WATER RUNOFF WHILE REMOVING DEBRIS AND POLLUTION.

Californians create about six pounds of trash each day. At this rate, it would take our campus only one week to fill the entire Walter Pyramid with 240,000 pounds of trash. This is just one reason Cal State Long Beach is committed to promoting sustainability through campus operations, academic programs, community efforts and initiatives.

Among the ways the university's efforts can be found are in solar energy panels, drought-tolerant plants, on-campus recycling, its Waste Not campaign and involvement in Climate Leadership Network and signatory Climate Commitment.

The Climate Commitment integrates the goal of achieving climate neutrality (reducing greenhouse gas emissions to zero) with the goal of climate resilience (building adaptive capacity to withstand inevitable climate impacts).

Meanwhile, the university's Waste Not program is designed to change the way our campus community thinks about waste, recycling and disposal. Founded on the principle of "waste not, want not," this program aims to promote policies and focus on reducing wasteful practices.

CSULB also has incorporated its sustainable efforts into its buildings with LEED certification. Currently, the university has one Platinum, five Gold and two Silver rated buildings. LEED stands for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, an internationally recognized green building certification.

The Parkside North Housing expansion project sets a new standard for CSU and higher education, as well as provides a model for future high-performance buildings that align with the CSU's carbon neutrality 2030 goals. The building is designed to reach the most progressive and regenerative sustainability goals that will lead to being the first Net-Zero Energy, Living Building Challenge Petal Certified, and LEED Platinum residential building in the CSU system.

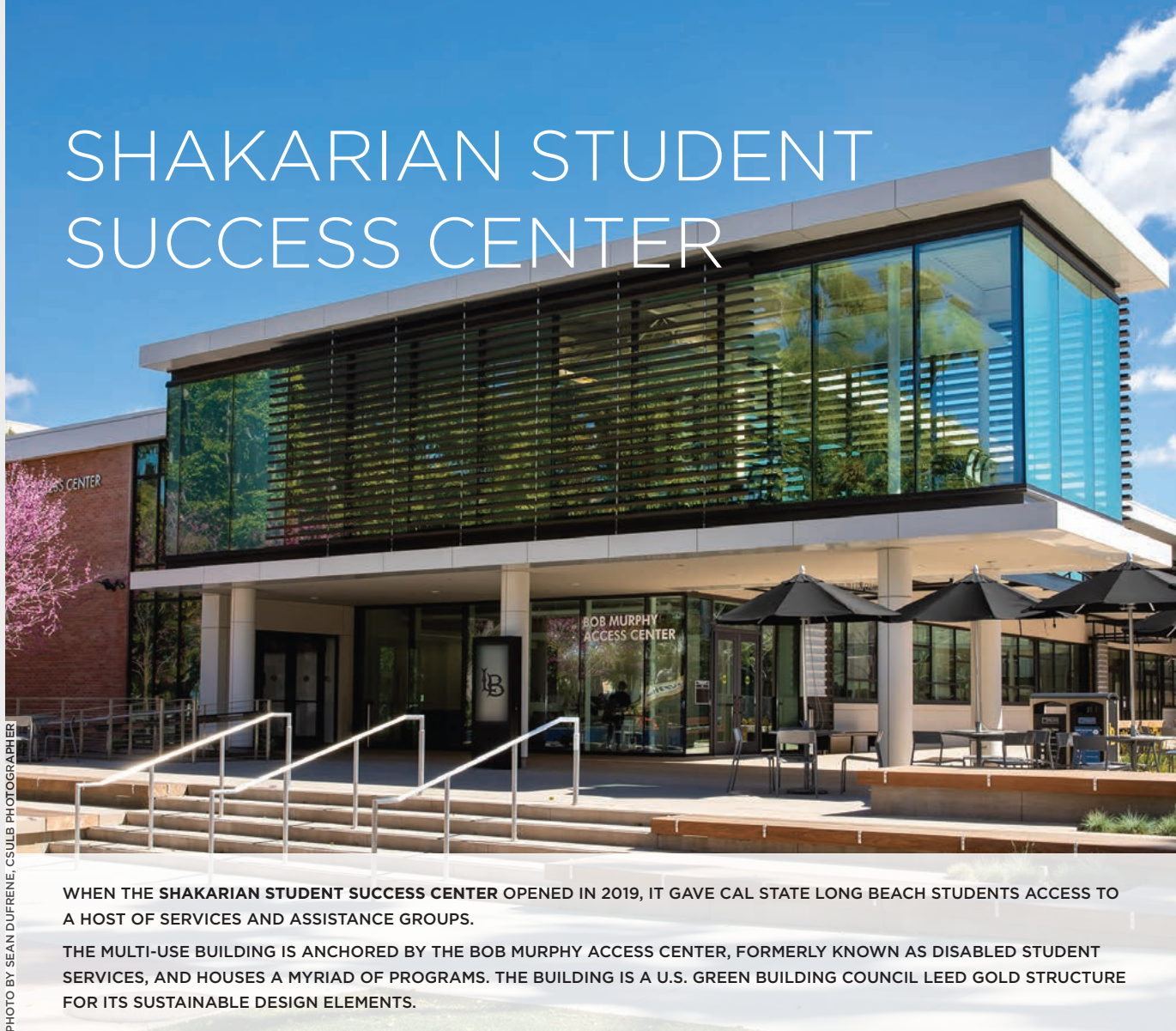

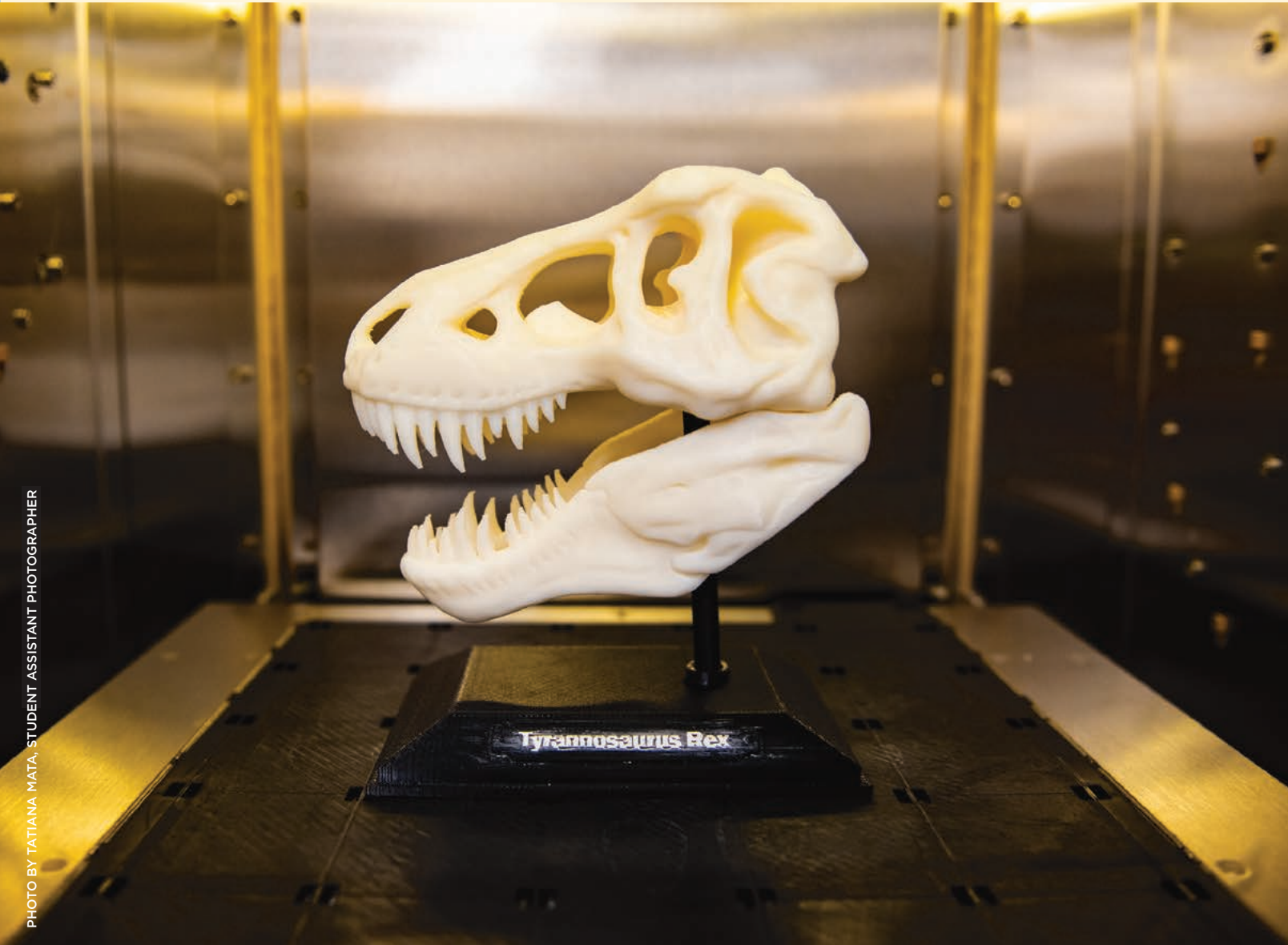

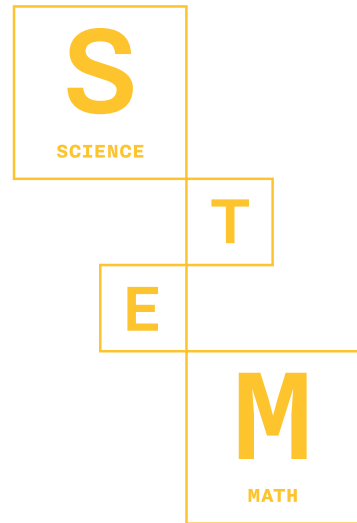
