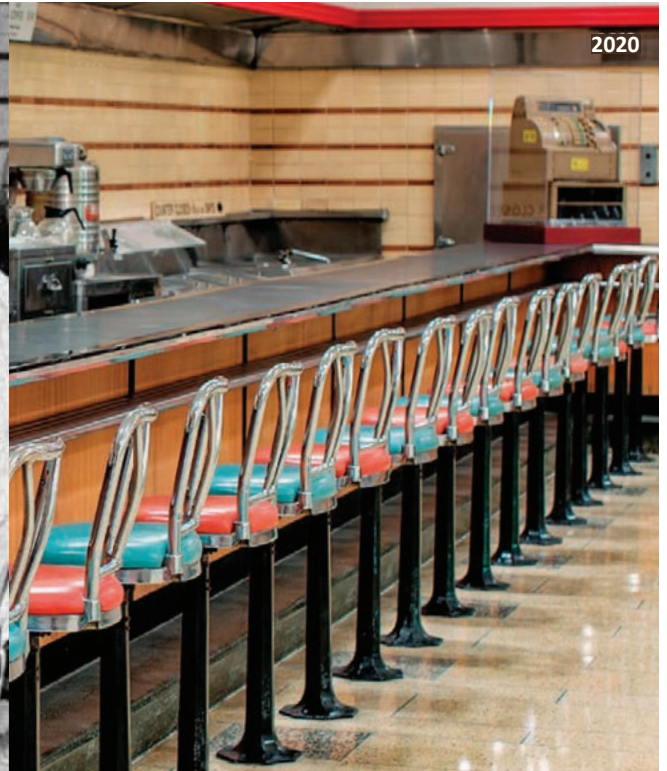

North Carolina A&T holds the distinction of being the nation's largest historically black university or college (HBCU), as well as one of its best and most accomplished. In addition to being ranked among the top National Universities and the no. 1 public HBCU in *U.S. News & World Report's* annual Best Colleges edition, N.C. A&T has also consistently been ranked one of this state's top three public research universities for more than a decade. We are also its most affordable, as consistently recognized in Money magazine's annual Best Colleges issue.

A new study of the university's annual economic impact shows that A&T's payroll and operations spending, together with construction, students, visitors, alumni, and start-up companies' spending, is now worth \$1.2 billion. That impact is responsible for hundreds of millions of dollars in added regional income and many thousands of jobs around the state and in Guilford, Forsyth, Alamance, Rockingham and Randolph counties.

An institution recognized nationally for its strengths in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education and research, A&T graduates more African American students in engineering, agriculture and recreation, parks and leisure studies than any campus in America. Our graduates are in exceptionally high demand; A&T hosts the largest career fairs in the University of North Carolina System to accommodate employers across the country who seek to hire our grads.

As one of the state's two land-grant institutions, A&T provides research-based educational programs and solutions to critical social, environmental, medical and educational issues for individuals, families and communities through the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Program. It is one of many ways that our university serves the people of this state – so effectively that we have been recognized with the Carnegie Foundation's prestigious Community Engagement designation.

During your visit to our campus and our city, please make time to engage with our students, employees, and alumni—the people who make this university great.

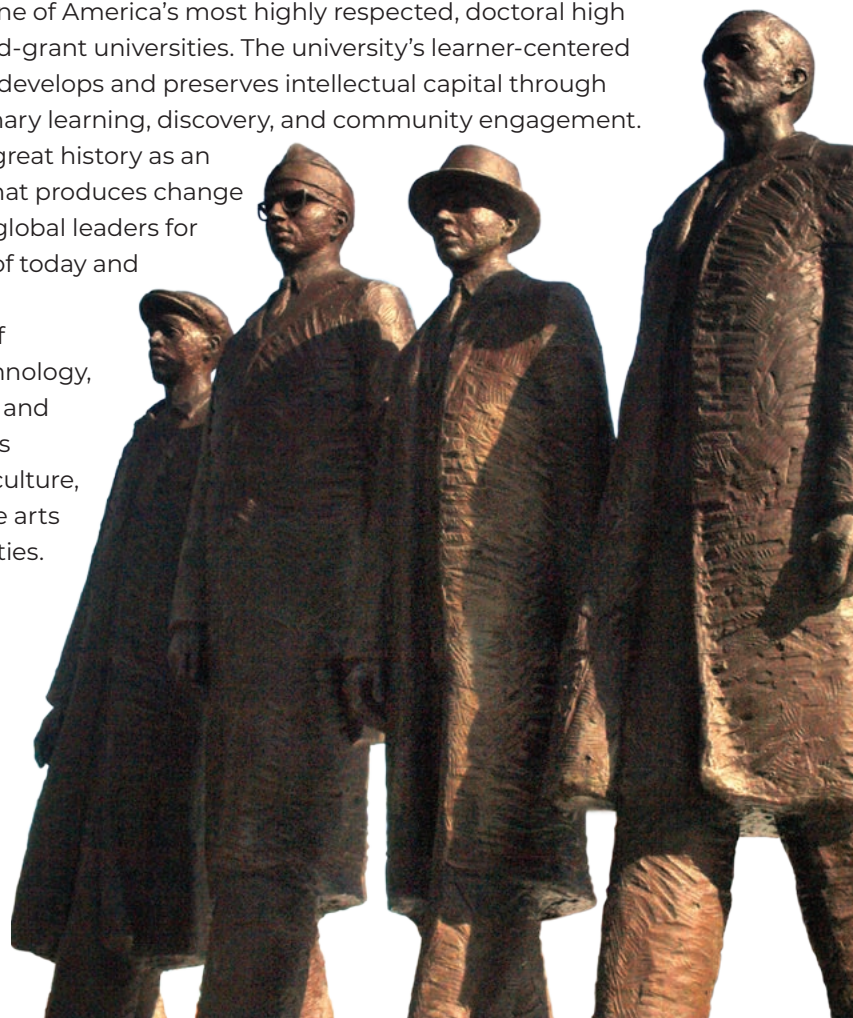
UNIVERSITY HISTORY

In 1890, Congress enacted the Second Morrill Act that mandated “a separate college for the colored race.” The Agricultural and Mechanical College for the Colored Race (now North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University) was established as that school in the state of North Carolina by an act of the General Assembly ratified on March 9, 1891. Originally operating in Raleigh as an annex to Shaw University, the college made a permanent home in Greensboro with the help of local citizens such as DeWitt Clinton Benbow and Charles H. Moore.

In 1915, state legislators changed the college’s name to the Agricultural and Technical College of North Carolina; and in 1967, they elevated it to university status. N.C. A&T became a constituent university of the University of North Carolina in 1972.

N.C. A&T is one of America's most highly respected, doctoral high research land-grant universities. The university’s learner-centered community develops and preserves intellectual capital through interdisciplinary learning, discovery, and community engagement.

Honoring a great history as an institution that produces change agents and global leaders for the careers of today and tomorrow in disciplines of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), agriculture, business, the arts and humanities.

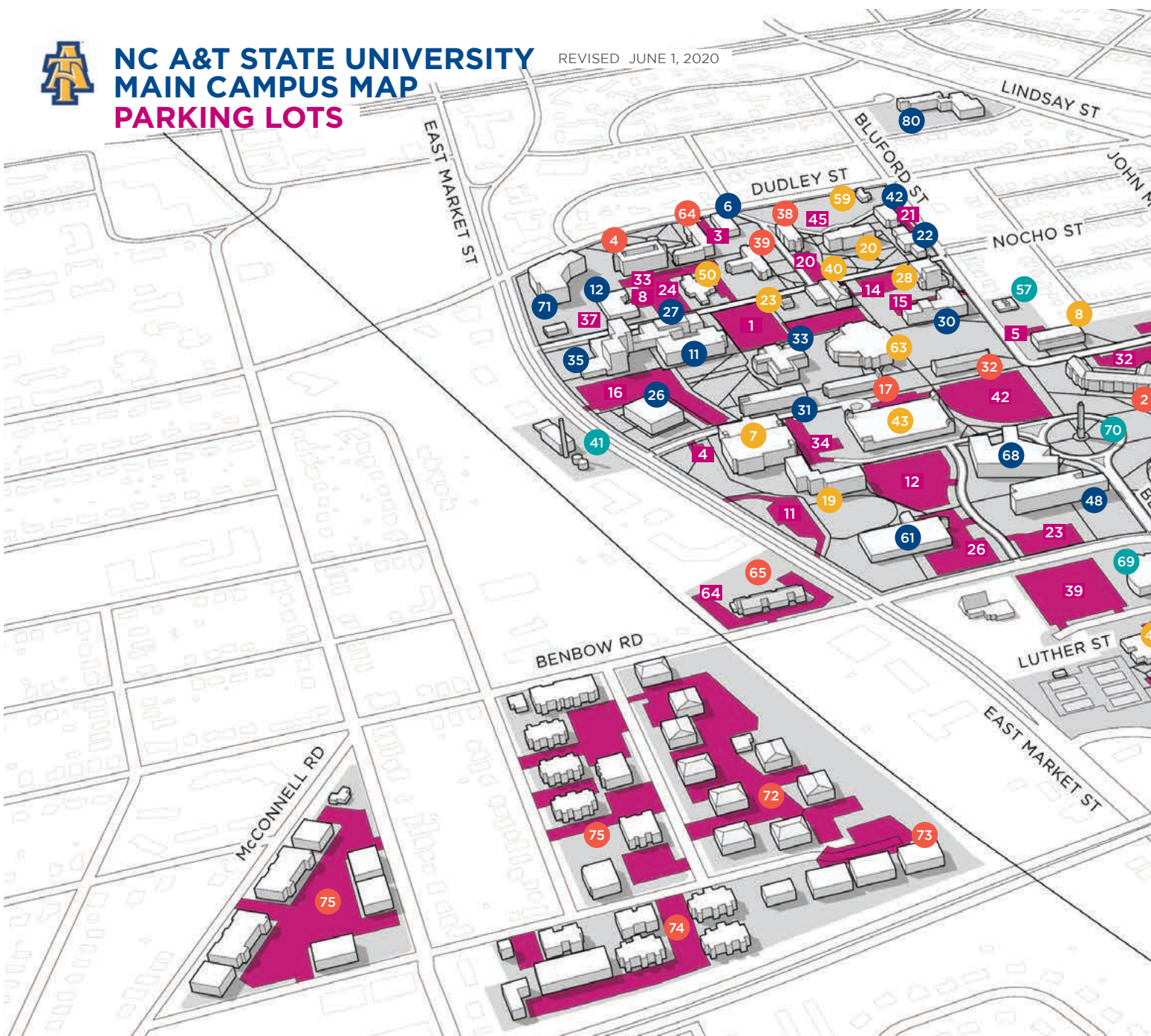

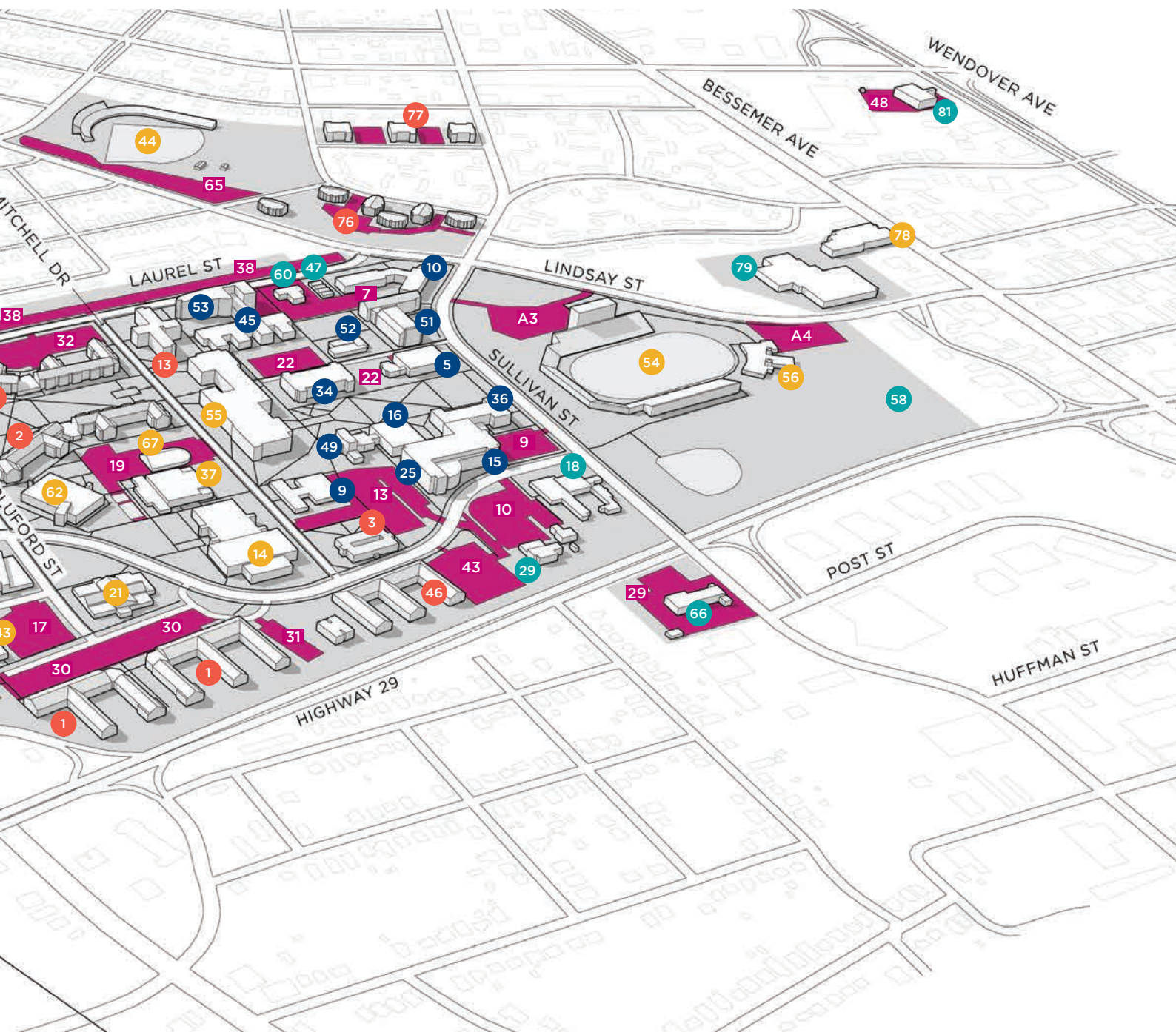

FINANCIAL AID

The primary goal of the Office of Student Financial Aid is to help students achieve their educational goals through financial support and resources. This office is committed to removing financial barriers for students wanting to pursue postsecondary learning and support each student admitted to N.C. A&T as well as educate students and families on how to responsibly manage expenses and debt.

THE AGGIE SCENE

THE REFLECTION POOL represents a historic event where students staged protests in response to a decision by administration to overturn the student council elections.



THE ALUMNI-FOUNDATION EVENT CENTER offers elegant ambiance for formal or informal events. It is the perfect place to host a conference, meeting, wedding, party or banquet. It is equipped with the latest in lighting and audio visual components all tailored to your budget. It is only minutes away from the heart of downtown Greensboro.

THE A&T FOUR - On Feb. 1, 1960 in Greensboro, North Carolina, four A&T freshmen, Ezell Blair Jr. (Jibreel Khazan), Franklin McCain, Joseph McNeil and David Richmond, walked downtown and “sat-in” at the whites-only lunch counter at Woolworth’s. They refused to leave when denied service and stayed until the store closed. The very next day, 25 students from A&T and other Greensboro colleges/universities joined them. In the next 10 days, students across the state of North Carolina participated in similar sit-ins. By week three, demonstrations had expanded to at least 250 major cities and towns across the country. Woolworth’s was desegregated by the end of July 1960. It was the protest of these four heroes that became the model and inspiration for later civil rights, anti-war and women’s liberations movements.



THE PLOT is an area where members of governed Greek letter organizations gather. Collectively they serve as the liaison between the university and students in matters of common interest. They also positively compete in scholarship, service and athletics.

TRUIST STADIUM is the home of N.C. A&T’s football games. It opened in 1981 and is the second largest on-campus football facility in the Triad. The stadium can hold 20,000+ spectators and includes accessibility services. It also houses athletic offices. The most recent addition to the stadium is the state-of-the-art video scoreboard to enhance the gameday experience.



THE DEESE CLOCK TOWER was made possible through the generosity of Willie A. ‘77 and Carol C. Deese, and was dedicated on March 24, 2016.

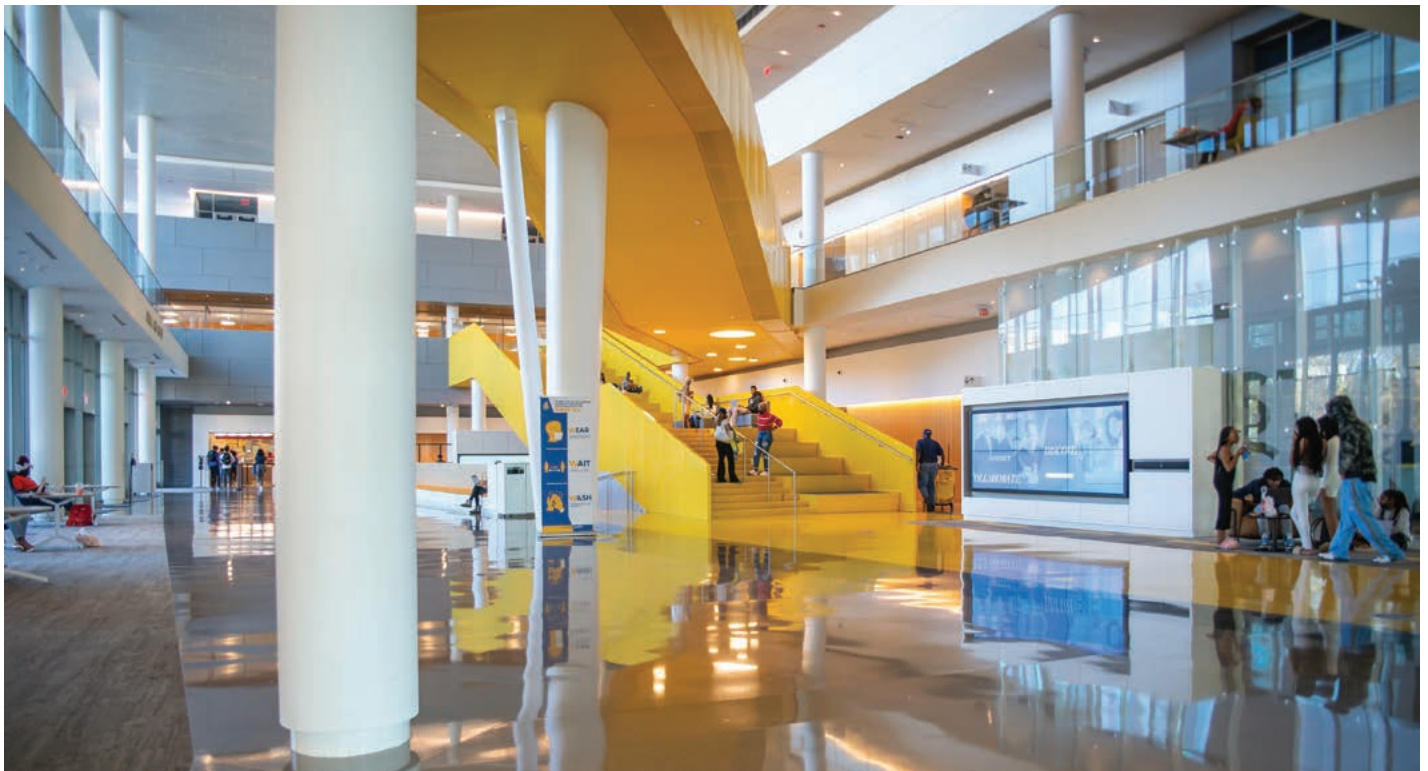

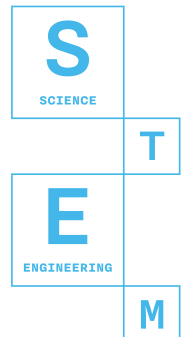
