QUEST FOR KNOWLEDGE

This 20-foot-wide granite and stainless steel sculpture was designed as a public artwork piece to accompany the building of the new library, now Zuhl Library, in 1992. According to the artist, Federico Armijo, the rocket-like column in the middle represents "how the thought process can be so fast" while the sphere symbolizes that "knowledge builds up. Almost like infinity." This is just one of several artwork pieces around NMSU anyone can enjoy while walking through campus.

Edgar R. Garrett Speech and Hearing Center


