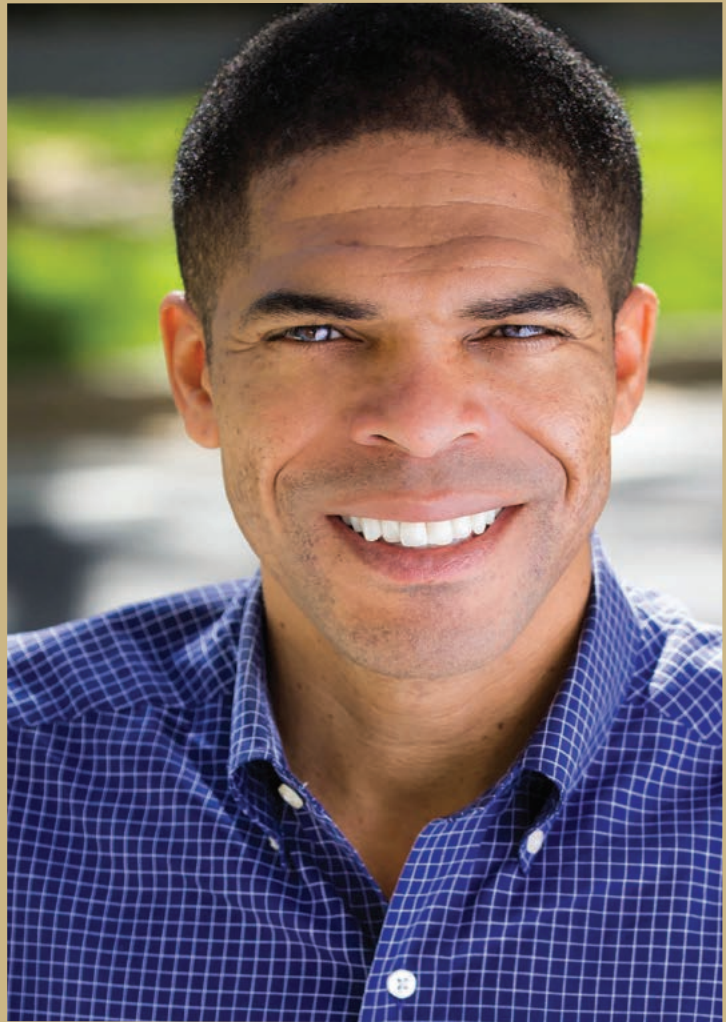

EASTBOUND HIGHWAY 50

Exit at Power Inn/Howe Avenue. Go under the freeway onto Hornet Drive. Turn left onto College Town Drive. The road becomes State University Drive and you are on the south end of campus.

WESTBOUND HIGHWAY 50

Exit at Howe Avenue. Continue through the light onto College Town Drive. At the second

light the road becomes State University Drive and you are on the south end of campus.

WESTBOUND BUSINESS 80

Exit at J Street. Turn left onto J Street and continue approximately 4 miles. Turn right onto Carlson/Esplanade. This is the north end of campus.

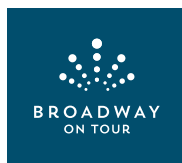

DESMOND HALL

Desmond Hall is a co-ed residence hall that houses approximately 250 students.

- There are double rooms and a limited number of deluxe-double rooms.
- The building is organized by alternating rooms with separate gender specific bath facilities.



DRAPER HALL

Draper Hall is a co-ed residence hall that houses approximately 208 students.

- Residents live in double-occupancy rooms.
- Each of the three floors are divided into separate corridors by a central stairwell with gender specific on one side and gender specific on the other.



JENKINS HALL

Jenkins Hall is a co-ed residence hall that houses approximately 208 students.

- Residents live in double-occupancy rooms.
- Each of the three floors are divided into separate corridors by a central stairwell with gender specific on one side and gender specific on the other.



SIERRA HALL

Sierra Hall is a co-ed residence hall that houses approximately 200 students.

- There is some variance in room design including double rooms, a limited number of singles and larger triple occupancy rooms.
- The building is organized by multi-directional corridors.
- Gender specific bath facilities are located on each floor.



SUTTER HALL

Sutter Hall is a co-ed residence hall that houses approximately 200 students.

- There is some variance in room design including double rooms, a limited number of singles and larger triple occupancy rooms.
- The building is organized by multi-directional corridors.
- Gender specific bath facilities are located on each floor.



AMERICAN RIVER COURTYARD

American River Courtyard is intended for sophomores, juniors, seniors, transfer, international and graduate students.

The hall houses 606 residents in an apartment-style suite setting. There are a variety of rooming options for students.

- 1 Bath Studio
- 2 Bedroom, 2 Bath Suite or Apartment (4 residents)
- 4 Bedroom, 2 Bath Suite (4 residents)

RIVERVIEW HALL

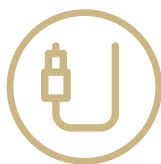

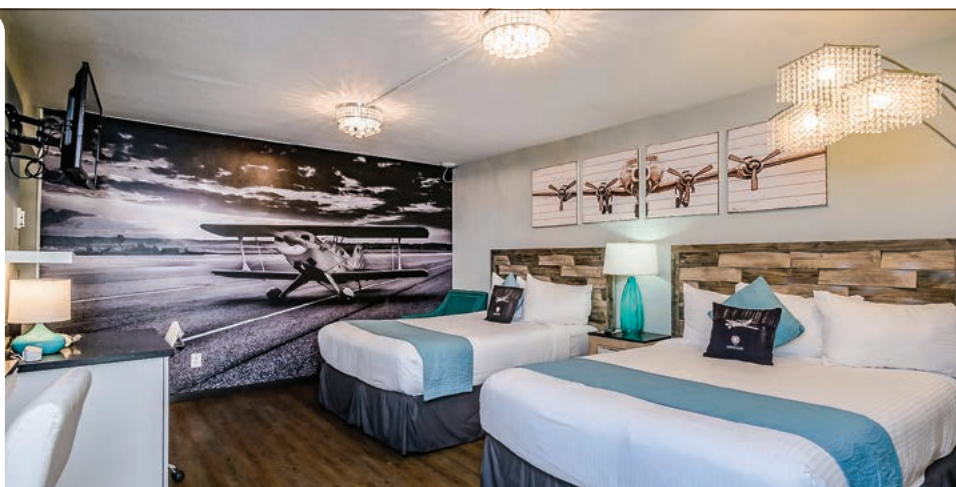

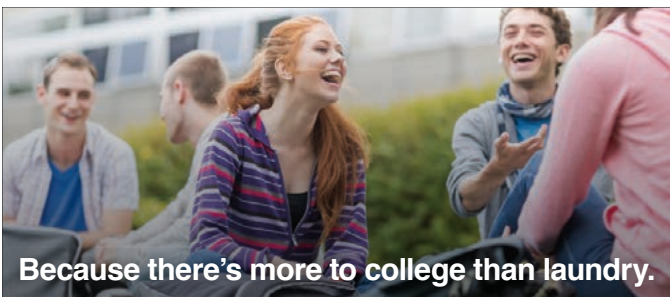

RESIDENCE HALL ASSOCIATION (RHA)

RHA is the student government and student voice for the 3200 residents living on-campus at North Village and Hornet Commons. RHA is committed to developing leadership, honoring diversity, and recognizing achievement, as well as stimulating engagement and involvement among students who reside in the residence halls. RHA coordinates a variety of open forums and events throughout the year providing residents with opportunities to engage intellectually and connect socially to their community.

HALL COUNCILS


