# Cover Feature: Campus Arboretum

In 1914, shortly after the construction of Hawai'i Hall, attention turned toward developing the campus, about 20 acres, into a botanical garden. By 1918, approximately 500 different plants - many from Hawai'i, Asia and the Americas - had been added to the grounds.

In 2016, the campus was formally accredited as an arboretum through the international ArbNet program. In the intervening century, academics, landscapers, students, staff, and visiting dignitaries added plants from throughout the Pacific and across the world. Today, the UH Mānoa campus has grown to about 320 acres and includes over 5,000 plants in over 900 taxa, including a number of Exceptional Trees, such as the largest Baobab in the United States. The Campus Arboretum works with Landscaping Services to develop the potential of unique woody flora of Hawai'i and the tropics by serving as a natural history collection for education and research, supporting service activities of the University of Hawai'i, and encouraging use by the broader community.

# Uniquely Hawai'i



- Native Hawaiians lived in Hawai'i for over one hundred generations with various island kingdoms. In 1810, Kamehameha I united all the islands under a single Hawaiian Kingdom.



- 'Iolani Palace is the only royal palace in the U.S. and had electricity five years before the White House and 17 years before Buckingham Palace.



- Duke Kahanamoku was a *Kanaka Maoli* (native Hawaiian) and a five-time Olympic medalist in swimming. He was also the world's best-known surfer and set the standards of modern day surfing.



- O'ahu was divided into six *moku* (districts). Moku were used to govern the management of underground water resources: 'Ewa, Ko'olauloa, Ko'olaupoko, Kona, Wai'anae, and Waialua.



- Each moku was divided into *ahupua'a* (wedge shaped land division extending from land to sea,) a total of 80 on O'ahu. The moku and ahupua'a system were designed for the most efficient food sustainability and land management.



- There are two mountain ranges on O'ahu; Ko'olau Mountains and Wai'anae Mountains.

THE STATE OF HAWAII HAS TWO OFFICIAL LANGUAGES:

## Hawaiian & English

'Ōlelo Hawai'i experienced a dramatic decline in the 20th century due to an English-only policy for all schools in Hawai'i. Today, Hawaiian language is recognized as an official language and the number of those who can speak Hawaiian has grown steadily in homes and in schools.

HAWAIIAN ALPHABET:

There are only 13 letters in the Hawaiian alphabet:

‘ A E I O U H K L M N P W

STATE MOTTO:

“Ua mau ke ea o ka 'āina i ka pono.”

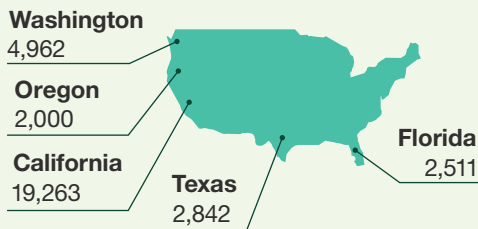
### Alumni in Hawai'i



### Alumni in U.S. Regions



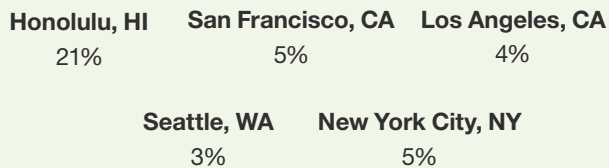
### Top 5 U.S. States in which alumni reside (excluding Hawai'i)



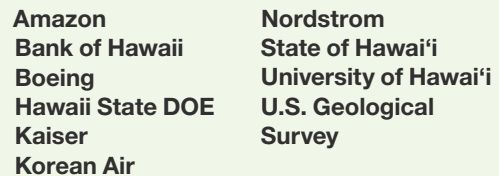
### Top 5 Countries in which alumni reside (excluding U.S.)

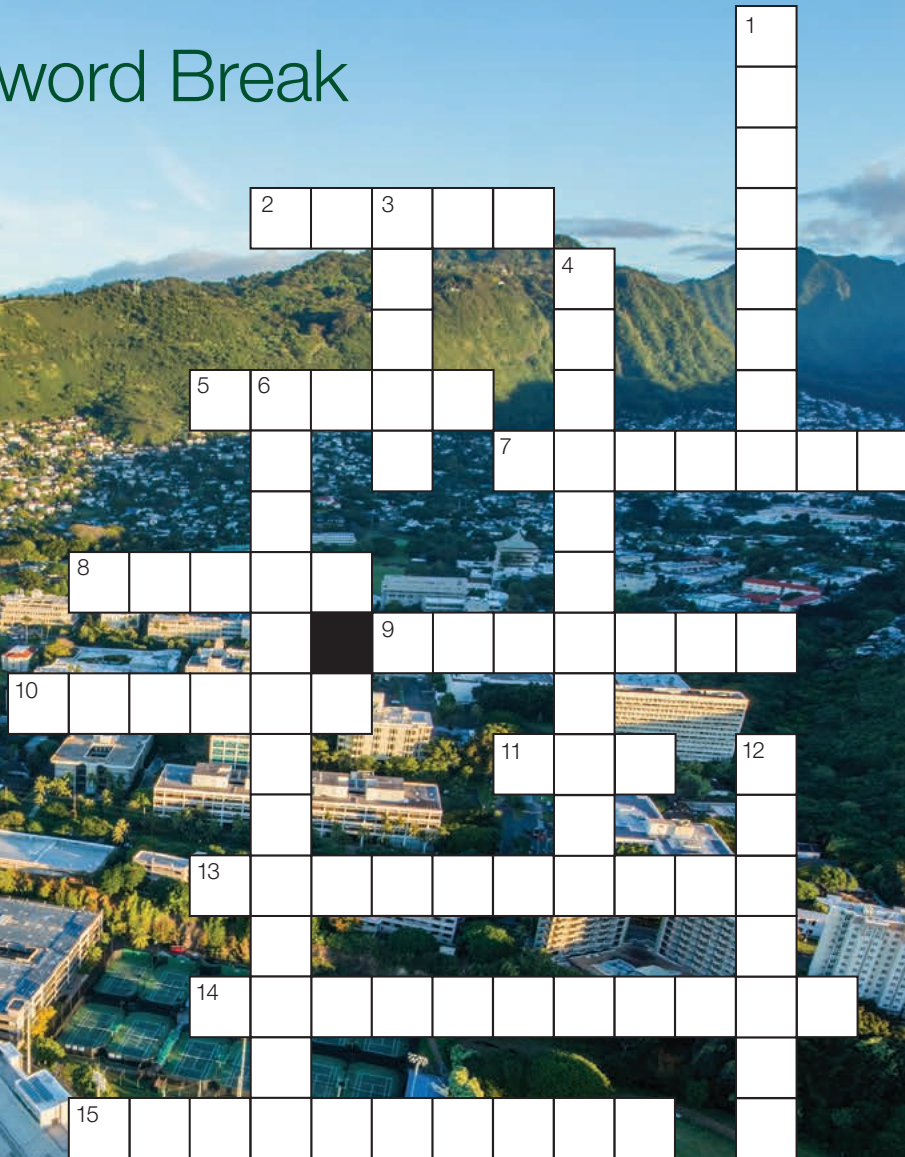
### Here are some ideas to help you pack

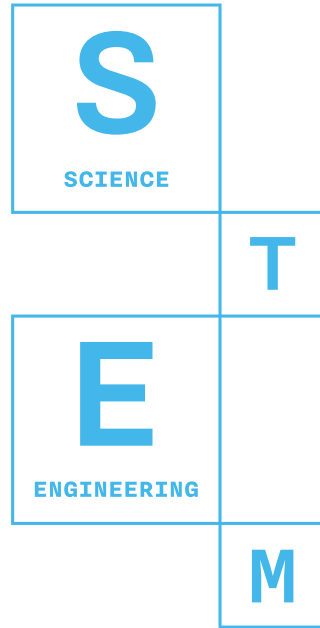
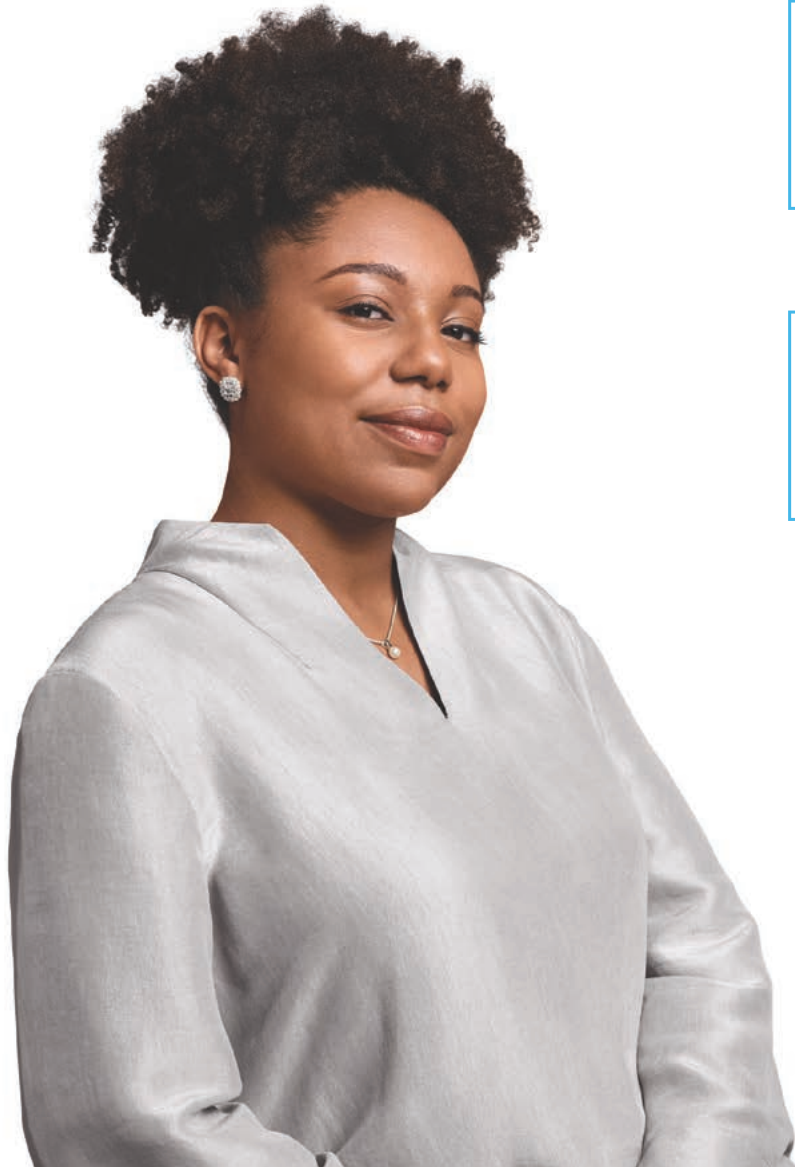

# Campus Traditions

## TEAM NAMES

Rainbow Warriors (men) & Rainbow Wahine (women)

## THE RAINBOW

Before 1923, UH teams were nicknamed the “Deans.” Then in the final game of the 1923 season, UH head coach Otto Klum’s squad upset Oregon State, 7-0, at Mo’ili’ili Field. During the game, a rainbow appeared over the field. Reporters started calling UH teams the Rainbows, and the tradition began that Hawai’i would not lose a game if a rainbow appeared.

## THE WARRIOR

The Warrior holds an honored place in Hawaiian history for it was the warrior who united the Hawaiian Islands under Kamehameha the Great. The Hawaiians expected the warrior to display great strength, skill and a fighting spirit.

## THEME SONG

The famous and iconic Hawai’i 5-0 theme song is played at all sporting events.

## THE WARRIOR CHANT

The Warrior Ha’a - a traditional Māori dance, the Warrior football team performs their version of the ha’a 20 minutes before every game.

## WELINA MĀNOA

An annual event that takes place on the first day of school to officially welcome incoming Rainbow Warriors to the University of Hawai’i at Mānoa. Welina Mānoa gathers campus organizations, student resources, and more so that students can fully connect to campus.

## HOMECOMING

Held every fall semester, Homecoming comprises week-long festivities that include a Homecoming Fair, Wahine (Women’s) volleyball game, the Homecoming football game, class reunions and special performances, exhibits, and lectures across campus.

## THE GIFT OF LEI

One of the most unique experiences of living in Hawai’i and being a student at UH Mānoa is the cultural tradition of lei giving at graduation and on senior night at all of our athletic events. As a celebratory and congratulatory gesture, the tradition of lei giving goes back centuries and is firmly rooted in Hawaiian culture. A lei is a garland of flowers that is worn around the neck and it is customary on special occasions to “lei” the person or individuals who are being honored. Graduation and senior night is a fun and very colorful experience unlike any other!
