

NOTED ALUMNA

UWM alumna Kimberley Cy Motley's quest for justice began in Milwaukee with an assignment in the Wisconsin State Public Defender's Office. In 2008, she stepped on the international stage, becoming the first and only foreign lawyer to litigate in Afghanistan's courts. She advocates for women, foreigners and many businesses being tried in a complicated legal system. Motley's unique practice has captured the attention of The New York Times, Vanity Fair, BBC and others, and became the focus of her TedTalk entitled "How I defend the rule of law," which has been viewed more than 1 million times. Her perseverance in Afghanistan is captured in the award-winning documentary about her work entitled "Motley's Law," which won awards at the DOC NYC and IDFA film festivals. Traveling the world and fighting for justice, Motley represents clients on almost every continent.

RESEARCH AT UW-MILWAUKEE

UWM offers more than 1,000 undergraduate research opportunities annually, and more than 500 of them involve paid positions. In fact, research is woven so tightly into UWM's academic culture that over half of our students have undergraduate research experience by the time they graduate. Here's just a glimpse of what some of our students have worked on.

Mikayla

GEOSCIENCE MAJOR

Lake Michigan's present-day shoreline looked quite different between 35,000 and 40,000 years ago, its geography mostly featuring marshes and bogs. Junior Mikayla is studying fossils deposited during that time to learn more about its ecosystems. She says her work with Scott Schaefer, a geosciences lecturer, in a Cudahy-area lakeshore park is like stepping back in time. Mikayla is also involved in GO FoRWARD, a program to encourage more people of color to go into the geosciences.







Emma


BIOLOGY MAJOR

Yellow perch are a staple of aquaculture and coveted by the dining public in the Great Lakes region. Emma, a senior and a UW System water fellow, has researched different ways of raising the perch, particularly how they're impacted by water temperature and salinity as they grow from the embryo and larval stages. This is important, Emma says, because climate change is making the Great Lakes warmer and saltier. Under mentor Dong Fang Deng, a senior scientist in the School of Freshwater Sciences, she's also looking at how microplastics in the water may affect yellow perch.

LIVE, LEARN **AND LEAD**

Live: All five UWM University Housing complexes are completely suite-style, meaning two to four connected bedrooms share a private bathroom. While UWM houses more than 4,000 students annually, our facilities are divided into smaller wings or houses that make it easy to find friends and make lasting social connections. Our residence halls provide space for your academic needs with computer labs, classrooms and study rooms. We also offer social common spaces like a movie theater, music practice rooms and game rooms.

UNIVERSITY Housing

The following represents our housing facilities under normal circumstances. During the COVID-19 pandemic, some housing has been changed to accomodate certain health and housing policies.

CAMBRIDGE COMMONS

Opened in 2010, Cambridge Commons houses 650 students, mostly in their first year. Here, you'll find a large courtyard, private music practice rooms, refrigerators in every suite and a full kitchen lounge on every floor.

RIVERVIEW

Opened in 2008, RiverView features first-year student housing in suites consisting of two double occupancy rooms. RiverView debuted a new movie theater and the RiverView Eatery in Fall 2019. Kitchen spaces on each floor allow students a space to prepare meals and gather as a community.

SANDBURG HALL

These four towers are UWM's original residence halls. The East Tower opened in 2001. This 2,800-person complex is its own mini-city, with a movie theater, coffee shop, convenience store and late-night dining facility.

KENILWORTH SQUARE APARTMENTS

Opened in 2006, Kenilworth Square houses 330 upper-level students. Previously a Ford Model T factory, the interior features high ceilings and loft-like architecture.

PURIN HALL

A converted apartment building, Purin Hall is our most compact residence hall, with 50 residents, most of whom are upper-level students. The small community features hardwood floors, ceiling fans and kitchens in each suite, which makes it feel like home.

Learn: UWM is home to more than 15 Living Learning Communities. These LLCs are smaller communities within communities that give students the chance to live on a floor with other students who share similar interests and/or career goals. Students in LLC programs generally have higher GPAs, higher graduation rates and report making friends faster than students who do not participate in LLCs. And there's no extra cost to being a part of an LLC. Visit **Ilc.uwm.edu** for more information.

Lead: University Housing provides great options for students to develop their own sense of leadership. All residents are invited to participate in their building's Community Council, where there are abundant opportunities for students of all communication and leadership styles. In addition, some residents may choose to run for a seat on the Student Housing Administrative Council, which is an advocacy and event-planning group.

MEAL PLANS

UWM's meal plans are set up with a debit-style account, where students pay for food items on an a la carte basis. This gives students the ultimate flexibility to customize their own nutritional plan.


OFFICE OF UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS



1. Lubar Entrepreneurship Center and UWM Welcome Center

2. Lubar Hall

The Lubar School of Business has been continuously accredited by AACSB International for over 45 years and offers students one of the best business educations in Wisconsin. Lubar Hall provides students with private computer labs, specialized career services and the David O. Nicholas Applied Finance Lab.

3. UWM Student Union

4. Bolton Hall

Bolton Hall houses multiple multicultural resource centers, the Office of Undergraduate Research and the Student Success Center. Bolton 150, one of the larger lecture halls at UWM, can be found on the first floor.

5. Helene Zelazo Center for the Performing Arts

Once the Congregation Emanu-El B'ne Jeshurun's synagogue, this building has become a rehearsal, classroom and performance space for our music and dance programs. The Helene Zelazo Center also houses the Helen Bader Concert Hall and Mary L. Nohl Art Galleries.

6. Mellencamp Hall

Mellencamp Hall is where you will find the offices of the Registrar and Financial Aid, Career Planning and Resource Center, New Student Programs, the Testing Center and the admission operations and processing area.

7. Mitchell Hall

Originally the main building for the Milwaukee State Normal School, Mitchell Hall now houses the Graduate School, the Accessibility Resource Center, art and dance studios, the film department and the bursar's or cashier's office. In 2017, the Emile H. Mathis Art Gallery opened here to display and house the expanding UWM art collection.

8. The Arts Center

The Arts Center building is home to the Peck School of the Arts, the only comprehensive arts school in the state of Wisconsin. This building houses the theatre, music and art departments. The Arts Center also hosts several performances throughout the year at the Mainstage Theatre, located on the first floor.

9. Golda Meir Library

10. Curtin Hall

Named for Jeremiah Curtin, who was said to have mastered 70 languages, Curtin Hall is where you will find UWM's foreign language department, which offers 19 different languages, including American Sign Language. The English and philosophy departments, as well as the Writing Center, can be found in Curtin Hall.

11. Vogel Hall

Built in 1936 as part of the Milwaukee-Downer Seminary campus, Vogel Hall is now the home of the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

12. Garland and Pearse Halls

Originally part of the Milwaukee-Downer Seminary campus, Garland and Pearse Halls house the office of the psychology department and the Center for International Education.

13. Holton Hall

Holton Hall is home to the largest college at UWM, the College of Letters & Science (L&S). L&S advises students in more than 40 programs.

14. Merrill Hall

Merrill Hall, which holds the oldest lecture hall on campus, is now home to the offices and classrooms of the College of Letters & Science.

15. Johnston Hall

This iconic building was originally a residence hall for the Milwaukee-Downer College, but now houses offices and classrooms.

16. Greene Hall

Originally the Milwaukee-Downer College library, this beautiful building is currently used as a conference/ meeting room for special events. Greene Hall is connected to the back of Merrill Hall.

17. Greene Museum

The Sam and Helen Stahl Greene Museum houses the Center for Jewish Studies, and serves the UWM campus and the Milwaukee community with courses and public events pertaining to Jewish studies.



1. LUBAR ENTREPRENEURSHIP CENTER AND UWM WELCOME CENTER

The Lubar Entrepreneurship Center is home to an array of programs that span levels and disciplines. These programs build on UWM's foundation in research. The LEC functions as a focal point for entrepreneurship education on campus and a pipeline of talent and resources for growing businesses in our region. At the UWM Welcome Center, you'll find our campus ambassadors, who are ready to greet you and help you navigate campus.

3. UWM STUDENT UNION

The Union is the exciting center of student life and activity on campus. the Union Cinema, the Rec Center, the life offices and resource centers.





9. GOLDA MEIR LIBRARY

Named for Golda Meir, who became the first female prime minister of Israel after spending most of her formative years in Milwaukee, students can find the American Geographical Society Library, which has over 1.3 million maps, atlases and other data files.

The Daniel M. Soref Learning Commons, on the first floor of the west wing, features group study rooms, the largest computer lab on campus, 24-hour access Sunday through Thursday, and a Grind coffee shop.

The east wing of the library contains more study space, tutoring and supplemental instruction for introductory courses.



18. Sabin Hall

Sabin Hall provides office space for the Department of Anthropology as well as lecture spaces, classrooms and offices.

19. The Klotsche Center & Pavilion

20. Downer Woods

Eleven acres of protected woodland make up Downer Woods, where research in natural science, botany and biology is often conducted. Campus visitors can enter Downer Woods, but please take only pictures and leave only footprints.

21. Norris Health Center

UWM's health center provides medical services to all enrolled students. Many services are free of charge, while prescriptions, some laboratory tests and selected procedures come with a small fee. Students with an active student ID can use Norris as many times as they need while attending UWM.

22. Enderis Hall

The 11-story building houses three of our 15 schools and colleges: the School of Education, the Helen Bader School of Social Welfare and the College of Health Sciences. The first floor features a student lounge with food service.

23. Chapman Hall

Chapman Hall was originally a library for the Milwaukee-Downer College. It now houses administration offices.

24. Sandburg Hall

25. Honors House

This building houses the UWM Honors College, including four distinctive classrooms, a private library and a hidden courtyard. Originally the home of the Columbia College of Nursing, its history and atmosphere have been preserved by UWM.

26. Northwest Quadrant

UWM acquired the former Columbia St. Mary's Hospital in late 2010. The nearly 11 acres include seven buildings, one of which is a five-story parking structure. The School of Information Studies, advising for the College of Health Sciences and the UWM Children's Learning Center call the Northwest Quadrant home.

27. Architecture & Urban Planning Building

Home to the only accredited program of architecture in Wisconsin, the School of Architecture & Urban Planning has classrooms, student studio lab space, a full metal and wood shop and multiple 3D printers. This building was designed specifically for architecture and urban planning students.

28. Lapham Hall

Students say this building rocks because of the geology department, which houses a seismograph to measure earthquakes worldwide. Zoology, biology and other natural science departments are also located within Lapham.

29. Engelmann Hall

UWM's indoor field is located in the west wing of this building. It is used for courses, leagues, tournaments and scheduled programs. Engelmann Hall also is home to the university's Department of Human Resources.

30. Cunningham Hall

The largest nursing program in the state of Wisconsin can be found here. Bachelor's, master's and doctoral programs give students experience with cutting-edge research in health care.

31. Laura Moynihan Field at Engelmann Stadium

Both the men's and women's soccer teams use this field with a two-star rating from FIFA, the highest rating for a synthetic field. That makes it one of the best college soccer environments in the country.

32. Chemistry Building

The four-story classroom section houses lecture halls and laboratories. The eight-story tower has research facilities and offices.

33. Engineering and Mathematical Sciences Building (EMS)

EMS contains laboratories, research facilities and the Johnson Controls Energy Advancement Research Lab, which gives students an opportunity to work with scientists to conduct research. This dry lab is the largest of its kind in North America.

34. Physics Building

Here, students can look at the stars at the Manfred Olson Planetarium. Students can partake in rooftop stargazing and observe space with astronomy equipment. The Physics Building also houses offices and classrooms.



24. SANDBURG HALL


